Buffalo Blue Bicycle is convenient and economical for anyone traveling on the campuses of UB or around the area. Buffalo Blue Bicycle is a lending program that gives members access to a fleet of metallic blue bicycles throughout the Buffalo area. More than 30 bicycles are available from seven on-campus hubs:

- At UB's Center of Excellence in Bioinformatics and Life Sciences, at the corner of Ellicott and Virginia Street
- Main Circle on the South Campus
- Clement Hall on the South Campus
- On the Rotary Road side of 220 Winspear – the UB Green office
- At the Student Union, North Campus
- Flint Loop on the North Campus
- At the entrance to the Ellicott Tunnel on the North Campus

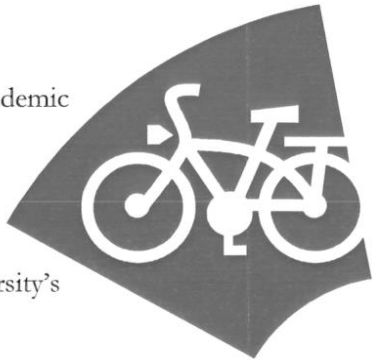
Bicycle Racks

Bicycling is a fun and exciting form of exercise that is a means of improving your physical and mental health.

Bicycling can help prevent chronic disease, raise your metabolic rate, and lead to your feeling more energized and fit! Biking is the transportation alternative that infuses fun and healthy energy to get you where you need to be.

UB has racks to support over 300 bicycles, located throughout its campuses. Key locations include:

- On the front of each UB Stampede bus
- Residence halls and apartments
- Main Circle
- Flint Loop
- Student Union
- Putnam Way/Academic Spine
- Seven Buffalo Blue Bicycle hubs throughout the University's campuses.



Bicycling Safety Tips

Bicyclists must obey all local and state Traffic Rules. Bicyclists have the same rights, privileges, and responsibilities as other vehicle operators. Given this, bicycles must be driven in similar fashion as other vehicles in order to be taken seriously by motorists. Safety tips:

- Never Ride Against Traffic
- Use Hand Signals when Turning
- Use Lights at Night
- One Person Per Bicycle
- Be Careful at Intersections
- Lock Your Bike!

Register your bicycle

It is to your advantage to register your bicycle with Parking and Transportation Services.

- **Bicycle registration is free!** Stickers can be obtained at either Parking and Transportation Services office.
- A registered bicycle deters theft and aids in recovery/return if stolen.
- Owners of registered bicycles can be contacted in the event that their bicycle needs to be removed.



- Bicycles may be impounded if they are impeding construction, vehicle or pedestrian traffic, or emergency vehicle access.
- Any clearly abandoned bicycle will be tagged with a written warning and impounded by the University after 30-days.
- Any impounded bicycle unclaimed after 90-days will be donated to charity.
- Bicycles locked to trees, signs or light poles will be notified of the nearest bicycle rack.
- When locking your bicycle, a U-lock is recommended. Never lock bicycle by the front wheel only, include the frame and wheel within lock.
